Dear Elementary Parents and Guardians:

I hope this letter finds you and your family safe and well during these challenging times as we continue to endure the COVID-19 pandemic. Thank you for the support and assistance you've given your children with remote learning; we understand the great effort that goes into this partnership. More than ever before, we realize the positive effects of in-person teaching and learning in brick and mortar schools that bring our students and adults together. As a school community, we also see how improved blended synchronous (in real time) and asynchronous (at any time) teaching and learning engages our students. Digital Education

Teachers, school psychologists, social workers, and administrators have been identifying students who have been disengaged or disconnected to remote learning. The school staff has been making numerous calls and some visits to homes to identify the challenges, while encouraging students and families to engage in learning. Unfortunately, those students who are not showing up for their lessons (in person or remotely) or who are not doing their work, are at risk of missing valuable learning opportunities. In partnership with families, the school staff will work to re-engage students in their learning so that they can make measured growth this year. We encourage families that are full remote to switch to the hybrid model if they are able to, in order to receive some in-person instruction. While some of our schools have had to shift to full remote learning at different times this fall due to the number of contacts to a few COVID-19 cases, we have not seen the transmission in the schools.

Elementary report cards will be available on PowerSchool on December 18, 2020. Last year, Groton shifted to on-line report cards that are more closely Aligned to Connecticut Core Standards, Next Generation Science Standards, as well as the district's curriculum. We use a scoring system of (1) needs more time, (2) progressing towards, (3) meets standard, and (4) exceeds "grade level expectations", for core areas in Reading, Writing, Math, Science, and Social Studies. You will see a different scoring system for electives, participation, and citizenship with the use of (C) for consistent, (I) for inconsistent and (N) needs improvement. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your child's teacher to assist you.

You have given us great insight to the successes and challenges you have noticed this fall through the parent survey and focus groups. All schools have analyzed the information and have created action plans as we move forward. We have learned a lot with regard to online learning and with the many resources that have been used this fall, and plan to carry with us valuable lessons about what works best in engaging our students through this school year. Have a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday and please stay safe and well during this time.
